



Grading Practices

Grade Level: 9-12

Homework

Homework will be assigned and graded on a scale of 0, 1, 2. A 2 will be assigned to homework that is submitted and complete; 1 will be assigned to homework that is submitted and partially complete; 0 will be assigned to homework that is not submitted. Homework will not be graded for accuracy, as the purpose of homework is to develop and practice needed skills and concepts. Homework will not exceed 10% of a student's cumulative grade.

Late Work

All homework, assignments and projects will be assigned a due date. Late work will not be accepted unless a student has met with the teacher and an extension has been approved by the teacher. There is no grading penalty for approved extensions. Parents, guidance and administration will be notified if students exhibit a chronic pattern of needing an extension.

Explanation of Zeroes

In assessing student learning, all student work is to be carefully considered. Therefore, zeroes for assignments, tests and/or quizzes will be removed from the grade book once they are completed by the students. Work not submitted on time will be considered late work and the late work policy will apply. Any zero in the gradebook at the end of the quarter are finalized and no longer subject for change. Students who exhibit a chronic pattern of behavior around missing work will receive the following support: parental notification, classroom interventions, referral for guidance support services, SRT meeting.

Reassessment

Students have the opportunity to learn from their mistakes. All students will be required regardless of grade to complete an error analysis of each assessment. The error analysis is a three component structured assignment. The students must correct all questions that are missed, identify the mistakes and what they would do differently in two or three sentences. This assignment will be graded to show growth and improvement.

Make-up Work

Regardless of excused or unexcused absences, all make-up work is due prior to the end of each unit. Students are responsible for scheduling time with the teacher to make-up any assessments that require supervision.

Extra Credit

Extra credit shall be used sparingly and purposefully as an opportunity for further learning. Any extra credit assignment is aligned to curricular objectives. Extra credit shall be related to the current topic of study, fairly available and accessible, and require the use of only those resources known to be available to all students. Extra credit will not be used for non-learning activities.
