10% or less homework grade

Late Work

Late work will be accepted under the following conditions:

- All work must be completed before the end of the 9 weeks.
- 10 points (100 point scale) will be deducted for late projects. All projects must be completed before the end of the 9 weeks
- No work accepted after report card grades are posted.
- Individual circumstances considered.

Explanation of Zeroes

Zero is used to inform students and parents that they have not completed an assignment. Every opportunity is given to students to complete the assignment by the end of the 9 weeks. Work not completed by the end of the 9 weeks will receive a Zero. Students who exhibit a chronic pattern of behavior around missing work need further evaluation and increased levels of support, such as: parental notification, classroom interventions, referral for guidance support services.

Reassessment

Any student who receives a failing grade on a summative (Performance-Based Assessment or major project) may be given an opportunity for additional instruction and reassessment provided that the student has:

- Participated in class.
- Completes assignments.
- Demonstrated evidence of best effort on the assessment and the learning leading up to the assessment.

No assessments are given after report card grades are posted.

Make-up Work

Make-up work will be accepted under the following conditions:

- All work must be completed before the end of the 9 weeks.
- Teacher will take into consideration a student's individual circumstances.

- No work accepted after report card grades are posted.

Extra Credit

In general, the LHS World Languages Department does not offer extra credit; however, teachers who decide to offer all students the opportunity to earn extra points on a graded assignment will align the assignment to curriculum standards.
